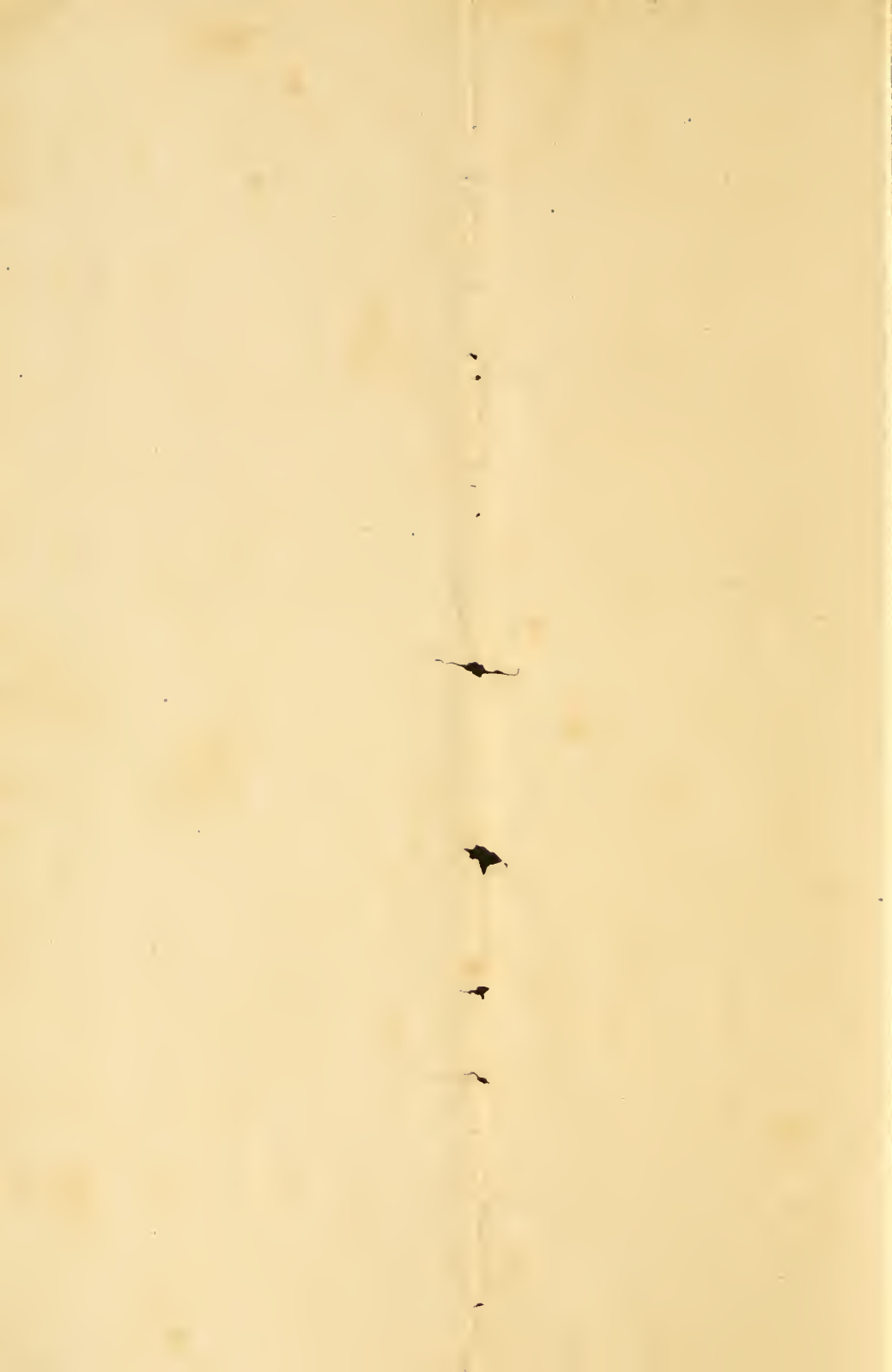

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MINUTES.

THE 27TH Annual Session of the Yellow Creek Baptist Association met pursuant to adjournment on Saturday, October 1st, 1887, with the Baptist Church at Shiloh, Lamar County, Alabama; W. C. Woods presiding as Moderator, and T. M. Woods acting as Clerk.

1st. At the hour of eleven o'clock a. m. the exercises were begun. Introductory Sermon by Rev. A. J. Mays, from Paul's second letter to Timothy, "Preach the Word."

Conclusion by Rev. S. M. Waldrep, after which an hour's intermission was given for refreshments, etc.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

2d. At 1 o'clock the Association reassembled by singing, and prayer was offered by the Moderator. Then proceeded to business as follows:

3 *Resolved*, That the thanks of this body are due, and are hereby tendered, to Shiloh church and vicinity for their kindness and hospitality shown us during our session and stay among them.

21st On motion the minutes were read and corrected.

22nd On motion after prayer and singing, while the brethren extended the parting hand, the body adjourned to meet again with Liberty Church two miles northeast of Detroit, Lamar county, Alabama.
